

A COPY OF THE LAST WILL & TESTAMENT OF CHARLES CRANMER, SIGNED & SEALED THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER A.D. 1870.

"WILL OF CHARLES CRAMER"

In the name of GOD, I Charles Cranmer of the Township of Bass River in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey. Being of sound mind & understanding for which blessing, I thank God, do make & publish this my last will & testament in maner [sic] following that is to say.

EXECUTION'S - First it is my will & I do order that all my just debts & funeral expenses be duly paid & satisfied as soon as conveniently can be after my decease.

MARY CRANMER - ITEM, I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Cranmer, the whole of my dwelling house, barn & other buildings attached, & belongings, homestead farm where I now live. Together with so much of the use & benefits arrising [sic] from said farms. While she lives as she thinks necessary for her maintainance [sic] & support together with all my household goods & kitchen furniture in lieu of her right of dower at common law. And after her decease the whole of the said farm & benefits arrising [sic] from these to go to my son Charles B. Cranmer & whatever of the household goods & kitchen furniture that may remain to be sold at Public sale, & disposed of as herein after mentioned Charles B. Cranmer.

CHARLES B. CRANMER - ITEM, I give & bequeath to my son the Homestead where I now live, that I bought of the Heirs & Executors of Francis French, & situated on the East side of Wading River & South-Easterly side of Ive's Branch, Willas [sic] Creek & is bounded East, : BEGINING [sic] - at the said mouth of Willit [sic] Creek where it empties in the Wading River, & southeasterly side of Ive's Branch thence bounding on the East side of said river (2) south 28 degrees, east along the south line of my place, 22 chains & fifty links to a stone corner to Lucy Johnson's 6 acres tract. Thence (3) south 25 degrees & 45 minutes, east 12 chains & 77 links to the 4th corner of a small survey, I made of 3 acres & 57 hundredths of an acre thence (4) south 88 & one quarter degrees east one chain thence (5) north 17 & three quarters with 4 chains & 20 links to the north-west corner of Lucy Johnson's place thence (6) along the line of the same 28 chains to the N.E. corner of Lucy Johnson's field thence (7) south easterly 5 degrees, east 5 chains & 70 links. To a large stone placed by me on the N. side of road leading from said Lucy Johnson line between my homestead place & the place formerly occupied by my son Thomas Cranmer. Thence (8) along said division line N. 25 degrees & 30 minutes east 43 chains & 20 links more or less to an old marked pine. S.E. corner to Leeks 90 acres survey N. of Iron Ore Spong, also being the begining [sic] corner of survey I made for 77 acres & 69 hundredeths [sic] thence (9) along the line of the same N. 70 degrees & 45 minutes west 24 chains thence (10) S. 88 links, thence (11) S. 6 degrees & 15 minutes east 6 chains to the S.E. corner of said survey, thence (12) along the line of the same, crossing the pond south 43 degrees & 45 minutes E. to the line of the line of the mill tract, on the E. side the pond thence (13) down said line on the E. side of the pond to a large black oak standing by the corner of the Black-Smith Shop, thence (14) S. 85 links to a stone corner to the mill lot on the S.E. side of the landing road thence (15) in a straight line to the first large Walnut tree in a S. Westerly corner from said stone so as to not interfere with the road to the landing. Thence (16) In a S. Easterly course leaving the small dwelling house & cellar house below the mill to the West of the line with sufficient [sic] ground for a garden, to the first Walnut tree below the house, standing by the fence in the edge of cripple. Thence (17) A due W. course to the aforesaid Willit [sic] Creek. Thence (18) down said creek the several course there of the place of beginning.

Containing - 100 acres more or less after excepting & reserving out of the said bounds the house & lots where he now lives. Containing about 11 acres which I have here in, after devised & bequeathed -

WILLIAM SEARS CRANMER (2nd son) ITEM - I give and bequeath to my son, William Sears Cranmer, the place where he now lives called & known as the Skooner property. Begining [sic] at a stone standing in the middle of the road leading from my place to Bass River. Between where Capt. Joseph Cale lives & where the line between my land, & land of Caleb W. Cranmer crosses on intersaid [sic] road. Thence runing [sic] along the said line & the Cove property, to a stone corner in the edge of a cripple on the S. side & near the S.W. of the cleared land. Thence (2) along the edge of cripple S. 82 degrees & 20 minutes east, 5 chains & 18 links to a stone in the edge of the cripple. Thence (3) south 15 minutes west to Merry Gold Stream. Thence (4) up said stream bounding on the same as far as my land extends to the line of land formerly belonging to Wm. Allen deceased, called & known by the name of Susannah Budd line. Thence (5) along the same to the afore said new road leading by where Capt. Joseph Cale now

lives from Bass River to Bridgeport. Thence (6) along said road by the several courses there of to the place of beginning [sic]. Containing 100 acres more or less being all that I own on the South side of said - east of Cove property, & north of Merry Gold Stream up to the North. The Heirs & assigns of George Cranmer deceased & late Wm. Allen.

Aaron G. Cranmer (twin to Wm. S. Cranmer) ITEM, I leave and bequeath to my son Aaron G. Cranmer The place where he now lives on the South side of the road from Bass River upper bridge to Bridgeport. Beginning [sic] at a stone & pine stump standing in the west edge of cripple. Being the 4th corner of a survey of 100 acres made to Thomas Ford. At the beginning corner of a 46 & three quarters acres made to Isaac Cranmer SR. A.D. 1797 [date written into text] & from thence running [sic] in S. Easterly direction in a straight line to a cedar tree marked for a witness to said corner formerly claimed by Wm. Allen as the corner to his & my lands. Thence (3) along said Allen line South 89 degrees & 15 minutes east 11 chains & 75 links to another corner of the same. Thence (4) along said Cranmer line N. 72 degrees & 30 minutes, east 26 chains & 50 links to another corner of said J.S. Cranmer lands, where he now lives. Thence (5) North 55 degrees & 30 minutes east 16 chains & 75 links to a large stone being the 5th corner of a survey of 20 acres made to John Forkes, & standing on South side of road leading from Charles A. Cranmer's to Bridgeport and by the west side of C.A. Cranmer's field. Thence (6) along the line of same North 57 degrees west to the middle of Aforesaid Public Road leading from C.A. Cranmer to Bridgeport. Thence (7) Along middle of said road westerly [sic] direction of stone corner standing 50 links east of the stone corner at the S.E. corner of the Eliza Baker lot, thence (8) due N. about 75 links to where said Eliza Baker lives. Thence (9) along said line 80 links more or less, the course being South 40 degrees west to his stone corner, in the said road. Thence (10) Still said road south 89 degrees west 2 chains & 85 links. Thence (11) South 26 degrees & 15 minutes, west 2 chains & 29 links. Thence (12) N. 70 degrees & 9 minutes, west 2 chains & 12 links. Thence (13) S. 24 degrees & 5 minutes west 16 chains & 50 links to the place of beginning [sic]. Containing 100 acres more or less.

HEIRS OF DERIAS CRANMER - ITEM, I give and bequeath to my 8 Grand Children namely, William, Charles, Caleb, Chalkey, & Danuel sons of my son Derias, deceased Lovina, Sarah, Anna & Emma daughters of my son Derias, deceased. The place where my son Thomas Cranmer, lived at the time of his deceased. Known by the name of Cavleer's place. To have & to hold, the boys 2 shares & the girls 1, that is to the girls to have one thirteenth each & the boys to have two thirteenth each. which said place is situated adjoining to the Westerly side of Merry Gold & bounded as follows. Beginning [sic] at a stone standing in the middle of the new road leading from my place through Merry Gold Swamp to Bass River, by Joseph A. Cales. which said stone standing in a line between Caleb W. Cranmer's land & my land, where said line intersects said road & is also the beginning [sic] corner. To the place herein bequeathed to my son Wm. Sears Cranmer, thence (1) bounded by said W S. Cranmer line along the middle of said road to where a course N. 14 degrees & 15 minutes west mill stake, & to the pine stump & stake standing for the 8th & last corner of a survey of 13 acres made to David Cavleer the 38th day of March A D. 1807. And from said Cavleer survey N. 12 degrees w. 13 chains & 25 links more or less. To the pine stump beginning [sic] course of said Cavleer survey, standing in the edge of the up land on the W. side of Merry Gold swamp. Thence, along west side of & up said swamp so as to include the fence & all the upland. But none of the Cedar swamp just in a N. westerly & 2nd in a northerly & easterly direction. To a pine stamp & stone the beginning [sic] corner to Isaac Cranmer survey of 22 & three quarters acres by the N. westerly side of Merry Gold swamp. Thence (4) in a straight line & in a N. westerly direction N. 29 degrees & 30 minutes west to old marked for a corner to Leeks 90 acre survey N. of Iron Ore Spong. Also corner to the Homestead place, here bequeath to my son Charles. Thence (5) along his lines S. 25 degrees & 30 minutes west, 43 chains & 20 links, to a large stone by the N. side of the road leading to Bass River Mill, by said Cavleer place where it crosses a small branch, between the Cavleer place & Lucy Johnson field. Thence (6) still along my son Charles' line N. 85 degrees W. 5 chains & 70 links to the N.E. corner of Lucy Johnson field. Thence (7) South 19 degrees & 6 minutes east, 12 chains & 73 links to a corner at the west end of certified line formerly established between Caleb W. Cranmer and myself. Thence (8) N. 76 degrees & three quarters west about 6 chains more or less to a stake corner to Caleb W. Cranmer land, by the S. side of Lucy Johnson field. Thence (9) along said Cranmer line in a s. easterly direction about 5 chains more to less to the place of beginning.[sic] - Containing about 100 acres more or less. I also give & bequeath to my 8 Grandchildren, sons & daughters of my son Derias Cranmer deceased, to be divided in like manner between them, a piece of Cedar swamp in Merry Gold branch adjoining to the place I have herein before bequeath to them. - Beginning at the 3rd corner there of & also being the 8th corner to the aforesaid David Cavleer survey of 13 acres & from thence running along the line of said survey N. 37 degrees & 39 minutes, East 15 chains more or less to the line of Wm. Allen east

called the Susanah Budd line. Thence (2) down the same s. 23 degrees & 15 minutes & 15 chains more or less to the middle of afore said new road crossing Merry Gold swamp to Bass River by Joseph Cale's' Thence (3) along the middle of road to the 2nd corner of the place I have herein last named & bequeathed to them. Thence (4) Along the line of the same N. & one quarter west to the pine stake & stump 8th corner to David Cavileer's acres & place of beginning [sic]. – Containing in acres more or less (NO AMOUNT GIVEN).

Isaac Cranmer Heirs, ITEM, I give & bequeath unto my daughter in law Elizebeth [sic] Cranmer, widow of my son Isaac Cranmer deceased, & my 8 grandchildren Rebecca Ann Rogers, Mary Hutchens, Sarah & Susanah Cranmer, (daughters) & Caleb W., Charles B. Isaac Bond, & Joseph Albert Cranmer sons of my son Isaac Cranmer deceased, all of that tract of land I bought of Richard Shin & Eliza his wife. Containing 15 & two hundreths [sic] acres & all the improvements there & situated near the RETREAT in the township of Southampton in the County of Burlington, on the road [text adds another "on the road"] leading from Retreat to Isaac Goldeys farm, by deed dated the 26th day of March A.D. 1860. And recorded in the clerks office at Mount Holly, in book M6 of deeds page 431. To have & to hold as herein after set forth, that is to say the boys "shares or 2 thirteenth each, & the girls one share or one thirteenth each. I also give & bequeath unto them the sum of \$800.00 to be appropriated strickly [sic] & truly the payment of debt on {text repeats "on"} ammount [sic] due on the Green Bire farm. Which my said daughter in law Elizabeth Cranmer purchased of the executors of Liba Shin deceased.

LIVINA CARTER, - ITEM, I give and bequeath to my daughter Livinia Carter, wife of John Carter the sum of \$500.00 to be paid to her by my executors herein after named as soon as conveniently can be done after my decease.

Edith E. Cranmer, ITEM, - I give & bequeath to my daughter Edith E. Cranmer, wife of John W. Cranmer now residing in the state of Iowa, the sum of \$500.00 to be payed [sic] to her by my executors as soon as conviently [sic] possible after my decease.

HEIRS OF Tabitha Cranmer, ITEM, - I give & bequeath unto my 4 grandchildren, Margaret Ann Allen, & Edith Eliza Cranmer, daughters & William & Uriah sons of my daughter Tabitha Cranmer all of the following, discribed [sic] tract of land with the improvements there on erected, situated on the N. side of road leading from Bass River upper bridge to Bridgeport. In Township of Bass River & adjoining to property I have herein bequeathed to my son William Sears Cranmer. family residing aforesaid. Beginning at a stone standing in the public road 50 lines east of the S.E. corner of the Andrew Loveland lot. Formerly land of Eliza Baker. And then running (1) along middle of said public road North 89 degrees east 32 chains & a half more or less, to where my line between my land & lands of Wm. Allen estate intersect & cross said road. Thence (2) along said line north 57 degrees west to the corner thence (3) South 72 degrees & 36 minutes West 16 chains & 74 links to a pine stump, old corner in Eliza Baker, & 75 links to Aaron G. Cranmer corner in said line. Thence (5) Along Aaron G. line due south 75 links, more or less to the place of begining [sic] - containing 25 acres & 27 hundreadths [sic] of an acre more or less.

HEIRS OF SAMUEL & THOMAS CRANMER, MY SONS, ITEMS, - I give & bequeath to my grandchildren Adolphus Cranmer & Serna Cranmer, children of Samuel Cranmer deceased, & Frank Walter Cranmer son of Thomas Cranmer deceased, the house & lot of land where my son Charles Cranmer now lives. On the left side of the road leading from my Mill & Homestead, to the bridge over Merry Gold at the old Isaac Cranmer place, & bounded as follows. 2 Viz"- Begining [sic] at stone standing in the middle of afore said road, where the new road or lane through my cleared land, in the easterly direction of Lucy Johnson place to Bass River. Inter sects the same & runs from, thence. (1) Up the road N. 21 degrees & a half, west 3 chains to a stone, thence (2) South 68 degrees, west 7 chains & 50 links more or less to the East edge of the swamp. Thence (3) Down by the swamp side about 6 chains to my stone corner standing, in the East edge of the Cedar swamp. Thence (4) Still down the swamp side 25 degrees & 45 minutes east 13 chains & 77 links to the 4th corner of my 3 & 57/100's acres survey, thence along the line of the same. (5) South 38 degrees east one chain to line of Lucy Johnson tract. Thence (6) Along to the line of same, N. 17 & 15 minutes, west 4 chains & 20 links to the N.W. corner of said Lucy Johnson tract. Thence (7) along the line of the same N. 63 degrees & 45 minutes, east 60 chains more or less. To the middle of afore said road, from Merry Gold bridge at the old Isaac Cranmer place, to my place or Mill. Thence (8) along middle of said road N. 21 degrees & 15 minutes west 11 chains & 70 links more or less to the place of begining [sic]. - Containing about 10 & ½ acres to have & to hold in the following names,

The boys to have 2 shares & the girls one, that is to say the boys 2/5's each & Girls 1/5th shares of said premises with all the improvements.

HEIRS OF URIAH CRANMER, ITEMS - I give and bequeath to my grandson URIAH 2nd the sum of \$400.00 to be paid to him, by my executors as soon as convient [sic] after my DECEASE. If he has arrived at the age of 21 years, & if not as soon as convient [sic] after he shall arrive at the age of 21 years.

HEIRS of MARY ANN ADAMS, - ITEMS, - I give & bequeath unto my (6) grandchildren, sons & daughters of my daughter, Mary Ann Adams, deceased, - VIZ- Achsah McCoy, Ellis Adams, (HUGH ADAMS), Tabitha Adams, Francis Asbury Adams & William Adams the sum of \$500.00 to be divided between them so as the boys shall have \$100.00 each & the girls \$50.00 each, & to be payed [sic] to them as soon as convient [sic], after my decease, or as soon as the boys arrive at the age of 21 years, & the girls at the age of 18 years. Or if married prior to that age, as soon as convient [sic] after my decease.

HEIRS OF WM. SEARS, ARRON [sic] G. & CHARLES B. CRANMER ITEM,- I give & bequeath to my 3 Three Sons, William S. Arron [sic] G. & Charles B. Cranmer. Each one equal 4th part or share & to my 5 grandsons - William, Charles, Caleb, Chalkey & Daniel D., sons of my son, Drius [sic] Cranmer, deceased, one 4th part or share to be equally divided between them, all of the Salt Marshes & black grass meadow on the Easterly side of Wading River, bounded by meadows belonging to the Estate of Maja Leek & others. Consisting of 3 lots bequeath [sic] to me by my Father, Isaac Cranmer deceased. Amounting in all to about 94 acres & 50/100ths of an acre, more or less. Also one other lot at the mouth of Loveland's Thorofare [sic], on the North side of Wading River, that I purchased of Samuel J. Reed, containing 15 acres more or less. The grandchildren to have one fourth between them & my 3 sons named on this bequest, the others. 3/4ths to be equally divided between them as afore said.

MARY CRANMER & CHARLES B. CRANMER, ITEM - As I have herein bequeathed to my beloved wife Mary Cranmer the whole of my Homestead farm, & dwelling house as long as she lives. And have also herein befor [sic] stated & bequeathed the same, to my Son, Charles B. Cranmer to have & to hold the same after her decease. I wish to explain that it is my will, & desire that my son Charles shall carry on & superentend [sic] & manage all the farming business for his Mother on terms to be agreed on between him & his Mother, as he has done for me & as she will not furnish lime, marl as I have done, & will not be likely to need a larger of the produce as I have received, it is my will & desire that such arrangements shall be made between them as shall fully satisfied. And be agreeable to my beloved wife first of all & as far as possible he be compensated, according to the usual custom & rules on share to my Charles for his labour, seeds, sowing, planting gathering & stowing away crops, for extra expences [sic] of manure, fertiliser [sic].

WILLIAM SEARS, AARON G. & CHARLES B., ITEM - I give & bequeath unto my 3 sons, Wm S., Aaron G., and Charles B. Cranmer, all of the Roggers survey that lives [sic] on the east side of Wading River. - Beginning at a west stone side of & near Tub Mill branch, containing 48 acres & 15-100/s of an acre adjoining land of Henry Rolland & others. Also one other tract of 151 & 56/100 acres above the old Stage road adjoining Ive's branch & adjoining land of John Lews estate, Howard Harris & others. The 2 last tracts I purchased of Z.M.P. Mathis & Rollin Ashley, executors [sic] of estate of Joseph B. Cranmer, deceased. I also give & bequeath to them a tract of 100 acres more or less adjoining on North side of Merry Gold & Wading River that I purchased at sale of real estate of my Mother Dorcas Cranmer deceased, to be equally divided between them. Also a tract of Cedar Swamp on Merry Gold branch including several lots. - Begining [sic] at the 8th corner of the David Cavileer survey of 13 acres, being a large pine stump & stake standing at the N.W. of a tract of swamp, I have herein bequeathed to my grandchildren. The Heirs of my son Derias Cranmer deceased. - And from thence running along their line North 7 degrees & 39 minutes. East about 15 chains more or less to WM. Allen or Susanah Budd line. Thence along the same west 23 degrees & 23 chains & 50 links more or less to a large pine stump & stone corner, to the same by the west side of swamp. Thence down by the west side of the swamp, so as not to interfere with the upland to the begining [sic] corner of the afore said, David Cavileer survey. Then down the reverse course of closing line of said survey. To the 8th corner there of & place of beginning [sic] 31 acres more or less, also 2 lots of Cedar Swamp.

Containing 31 acres more or less, also 2 lots of Cedar swamp adjoining the above that I purchased of Z.M. P. Mathis, Joseph P. Cranmer & George T. Slack, commissioners to the estate of William Allen deceased.

Containing about 15 & 18/100ths of an acre more or less, by deed dated the 19th day of May A.D. 1863, & recorded at Mount Holly in clerks office in book L.6. of deeds page 319.

EXECUTOR - ITEM, - I do hereby order & direct my Executor herein after named to advertise & sell at Public Sale a tract of Pine Land & Cedar Swamp, situated & adjoining to Leeks 90 acres survey on the West, & land herein bequeathed to my son, Aaron G. Cranmer. (This was grandfather to Mrs. Rae Adare Carr) [obviously the copyist's addition], - On the east & included at tract of 3 acres of land, that I bought of Thomas French, & Hannah his wife, by deeds dated the 6th day of January A.D. 1824. Which together makes About 74 acres, of Pine Upland & Cedar Swamp. – Begining [sic] at a large old Pine Tree marked for a corner stone at the S.E. corner of Leeks 90 acres, survey. And also begining [sic] corner of Charles Cranmer 77 & 69/100ths & runs from thence along the line of Leeks 90 acres. North 13 degrees 29 chains & 50 links to the corner of Leeks 90 acres. Thence (2) south 34 & ½ east degrees, 24 chains & 34 links to 4th corner of Thomas Ford's 100 acres. Thence (3) south 40 degrees west 14 chains more or less to the 3rd corner of the 3 acres above discribed [sic], thence along the line of the same several courses, thereof to a large Pine Stump or stone to the begining [sic] corner of Isaac Cranmer's 22 & 75/100ths acres, also begining [sic] corner of afore said 3 acres. Thence (4) North 29 degrees & 30 minutes west 18 chains & 50 links to the Pine Tree first named & place of begining [sic].

WILLIAM SEARS, AARON G., & CHARLES B. CRANMER, ITEM, I give & bequeath to my 3 sons, WM S., Aaron G. & Charles B. the Saw Mill & the little House & garden & landing below the Mill, & the saw mill tract. Now known as Charles Cranmer's Mill, formerly known as French & Leeks. Which said tract is fully discribed [sic] in deed from my father Isaac Cranmer, & Dorcas Adams Cranmer his wife. Which he made to me for 1/4th of his right & title dated the 20th day of May A.D. 1825, & is recorded in Clerks Office at Mount Holly in book 43 of deeds page 225. As by reference to the same Mill appears & the remaining 3/4ths I bought of Charles Adams & Jessie Evans, Executors at there [sic] sale of Real Estate of my Father with other property. ITEM It is my will & I do order Executors & direct that if there should be any residue of my Estate, either person or real estate after paying the legacies & performing & executing the devices herein made my children, each one sharing 1/12th there, that may be living at the time of my decease. And the children of those who have departed this life prior to my decease, to have what there [sic] parents share would have been. Namely 1/12th part of said residue provided they had survived my decease. And lastly I do hereby appoint my 3 sons, William Sears, Aaron G. & Charles B. Cranmer & my trusty & well beloved friend, Zebulon M.P. Mathis, Executors of this my last will & testament in witness where of I have herein unto set my hand and seal, this 3rd day of March in the year of our LORD One thousand & eight Hundred & sixty Six (1866)

NOTE, THE FOLLOWING IS A CODICIL ADDED TO CHARLES CRANMER WILL ON NOVEMBER 11th, 1870.

I CHARLES CRANMER the within named Testator, do hereby make & publish this CODICIL, to my last Will & Testament bearing date, the 11th day of November A.D. 1870. In manner following. To Writ [sic], ITEM, William Sears, Aaron G. & Charles B. Cranmer. I do revoke the demise in my said will, containing the division of my Mill Property, known as Charles Cranmer Saw Mill.

ITEM, I give & bequeath to my son Aaron G. Cranmer, one half of said saw mill & mill property & the other or remaining half to my two other sons, Wm. S. & Chas. B. Cranmer equally.

EXECUTORS, ITEM, And will & order that my Property known as the Edwards Property at Bridgeport and also my House & Lot at Bass River adjoining the Methodist Church Property, & also the meadow at the mouth of Goose Creek, known as the Townsend meadow, to be sold by my Executors & the proceeds of said sale go to pay the Legacies mentioned in my last will.

EXECUTORS, ITEM, And I further will & order that all money left after my just debts & funeral expences [sic] be paid, to be equally divided between my children, those of them that are dead, there [sic] share to be given to their children.

TOBITHA ADAMS, ITEM, I give & bequeath to my granddaughter [sic] Tobitha Adams the sum of \$100.00 to be paid to her befor [sic] the division, mentioned in above ITEM to be made.

In testimony whereof the said Charles Cranmer, have to this CODICIL afixed [sic] my name, & afixed [sic] my seal, this 11th day of November in the year of our LORD, One Thousand Eight Hundred & Seventy (1870).
