- (a) Capt. Angus, in a voyage to Ternerriffe, fought off a snow of 16 guns, and afterwards 2 armed schooners and a sloop, with a loss of 2 killed and 8 wounded.
- (b) In April, 1779 Capt. Lawler captured a schooner of 10 guns, also 2 armed sloops. In July following, captured a brig of 16 guns with a loss of 6 killed, the Captain and 15 wounded. The enemy had 6 killed and 20 wounded.
- (c) In June, 1779, captured the ship Diana, having on board 80 cannons, 60 swivels and 10 cohorts. In August she made 4 other captures.
- (d) In February, 1781, Capt. Kean captured the British cutter Hypocrite of 16 guns after a fifteen minute action, and a loss of killed and 1 wounded. The cutter had 4 killed and 7 wounded.
- (e) On April 8, 1782 in the Delaware Bay, the *Hyder Ally* engaged and captured the *Gen. Monk*, of 20 guns and 136 men, Capt. Rogus, after one of the best fought actions of record, with a loss of 4 killed and 11 wounded on the *Hyder Ally*, and 20 killed and 33 wounded on board the *Gen. Monk*. The guns of the *Hyder Ally* were Six pounders, and the *Gen. Monk's* were nine pounders.

The latter was re-captured the next day.
- (b) On June 29, 1776, she was chased on shore off Cape Henry, and boarded by the enemy, when she blew up. The crew and a portion of the cargo had been previously removed.
